Year 4 will be swimming **every Monday** afternoon until the 3rd April. Please make sure you collect your child at 3.30pm on Mondays.

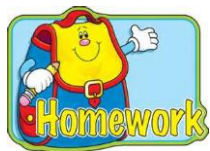
Please bring P.E kits into school **every Friday** as we begin our dance lessons this spring term.

A reminder that this week is a celebration of literature. Remember to come in dressed as your favourite character from a book on **Thursday 2nd March**.



Homework

Also, children are taught new spelling rules every **Monday**. These will be taught in class with a supporting sheet sent home that day. On the following **Thursday**, children will take part in a short spelling test which will check their understanding of the rule.



Home reading book/diary

To support children's reading and writing in school, your child is expected to read their home reading book **each night**. They must bring their reading book, along with their diary, which should be signed and dated by a parent/guardian who has heard their child read in to school each morning. We will check your child's reading diary to see if they have read daily every lunchtime. If they have read the night before and their diary is signed they will receive a fabulous sticker to commend their efforts.

Please remember that homework is a vital part of your child's learning and, if it is not completed, or is not to the appropriate standard we expect then they will complete it in their break time.
